

OUTER BANKS – “NIGHTS IN RODANTHE”

May 2-4, 2010

Travel to the beautiful Outer Banks of North Carolina to revel in the romantic settings of the movie “Nights In Rodanthe.” As we travel through the beautiful Cape Hatteras National Seashore, visit many filming locations, see photogenic lighthouses, dine on Hatteras Island, and ferry to pretty Ocracoke, where Blackbeard the Pirate met his fate. You’ll bring back a treasure trove of memories from this scenic adventure!

DAY 1: Arriving on the beautiful Outer Banks of North Carolina, check into Ramada Plaza Resort Nags Head Beach in Kill Devil Hills, NC (252-441-2151), where we will stay two nights. Enjoy dinner this evening at Kelly’s Restaurant and Tavern. (dinner)

DAY 2: Enjoy the full breakfast buffet at the hotel before embarking with our guide on our journey south down the narrow ribbon of islands that form picturesque Cape Hatteras National Seashore. Along this scenic route, visit

many settings for the romantic movie, “Nights in Rodanthe,” starring Richard Gere and Diane Lane, based on the novel by Nicholas Sparks. On Bodie Island, see the distinctive Bodie Island Lighthouse. After crossing Oregon Inlet, see Rodanthe, the seaside village named in the movie title. (It’s pronounced “row-DAN-thee.”) See “Serendipity,” the big beach house that served as the inn in the film. Storms since the filming caused the sea to surround the house, but new owners arranged a rescue. The same company that moved the Cape Hatteras

Lighthouse inland moved this 45-foot tall structure half a mile down Highway 12 in January of 2010 to a new beachfront location further from the surf! Nearby, see the famed Chicamacomico Life Saving Station, where we will meet an actor from the film. Also see JoBob’s Trading Post, where villagers stocked up to prepare for the movie’s storm, Hatteras Island Fishing Pier, where

Gere and Lane celebrated surviving the storm, Old Gray House, where local artists and artisans display their crafts, and the classic Cape Hatteras Lighthouse, the tallest lighthouse in America, which guides ships past the dangerous shoals known as the “Graveyard of the Atlantic.” Reaching the end of the highway, board the ferry that Richard Gere used in the film and delight in a 45-minute cruise to Ocracoke Island. This quaint resort and fishing village boasts one of

America’s most beautiful beaches, as well as the legend of Blackbeard, the pirate who died in battle here in 1718. Ferry back to Hatteras Island to enjoy dinner in Buxton Village at the Diamond Shoals Restaurant before motoring back to our hotel for a restful night’s sleep after our beautiful adventure. (breakfast, dinner)

DAY 3: After enjoying the breakfast buffet in the hotel, depart from the glorious Outer Banks, bringing home bright memories of a beautiful adventure. Expected arrival in Hunt Valley is 5:20 PM, Shrewsbury 5:40 PM, York 6:00 PM, Red Lion 6:30 PM. (breakfast)
